



Dear OMC, Affiliated Member Countries' Jurors,

We are pleased to present this **Jury Guidebook**, designed to support all affiliated jurors in maintaining the highest standards of excellence when judging OMC international competitions worldwide.

To ensure fair and unbiased results, OMC has introduced a new **jury grouping system**. Each jury group will consist of eight jurors, as follows:

- **Five OMC professional jurors** comprised of OMC Competition Directors or jurors selected from the OMC supranational jurors.
- Three supranational jurors, selected from the affiliated member countries' organizations.
- OMC wishes that the official countries' jurors are also their national trainers having the experience and knowledge of selecting the best work on the championship arena.

Jurors attending the 2025 OMC GLOBAL SYMPOSIUM in Milano will have the priority to judge in the OMC World Championship in Paris representing their countries. OMC will request all countries affiliated organizations to summit only 1 juror per section: Hair-Ladies & Gents, Aesthetics & Nails.

We thank you for your continued dedication and commitment to upholding OMC's values of excellence and professionalism.

OMC Professional and Supranational Jurors

OMC Jury Selection: Only official jurors from affiliated organizations who attended the 2025 OMC GLOBAL SYMPOSIUM in Milan will be given priority to judge at the 2025 OMC World Championship. The OMC Committee will make the final selection. For countries with multiple organizations, OMC will select the organization with the highest number of registered competitors. Additionally, national jurors from that organization must have attended the OMC Jury Seminar in Milan.

OMC Professional Jurors: OMC Competition Directors are recognized as professional jurors representing OMC HAIRWORLD.

OMC National Jurors: OMC will request all affiliated national organizations to nominate one juror per section— Hair Ladies & Gents, Aesthetics, and Nails— provided that these jurors have attended the 2025 OMC Jury Seminar in Milan. The OMC Competition Committee reserves the right to appoint additional qualified jurors to represent the OMC.

OMC Jury Groups: The OMC Jury Group comprises eight members, consisting of: Five (5) professional jurors. Three (3) supranational jurors.

Scoring System: If a juror's score is assigned to a competitor from their own country, that score will be omitted and replaced with the average of the other jurors' scores. Any violations will result in "Red Cards", as outlined on Page 8. In the event of a tie, the Jury President's score will determine the winner. *(Refer to the Jury Guidebook, Page 15, for details.*

Jury Briefing: The jury briefing will take place during the Global Jury Seminar as well as the day before the championship. Only selected jurors will receive an envelope detailing which tests they will judge, provided they attended the latest OMC Jury Seminar.

Fair Judging: To ensure fairness, a juror's score for their own country does not count.

New Jurors: The OMC Competition Committee will determine whether the scores from new jurors will be included.

Jurors' Dress Code: To establish a unified dress code, the following guidelines must be observed Gents Jurors: Must wear black attire during the judging segment. The outfit can be trendy or classic. Shirts and scarves may be of any color. Ladies Jurors: The dress code is white, blue, or black, with additional accent colors permitted.

Juror Disqualification: The OMC Competition Committee will determine appropriate sanctions based on the severity of the infraction.

OMC Scoring System Example

Jurors' country scores, as well as red cards, are removed and replaced by the average of all other jurors, based on the first rectification of the jurors concerned.

<u>Scores given by jurors</u> 28 - 26 - 30 - 27 - 28 - 25 - 25

<u>First rectification</u> Scores given by jurors to competitors of their own country are omitted (27 in this case)

Calculation of first average omitting score 27 28 + 26 + 30 + 28 + 25 + 25 = 162: 6 = 27

New average based on the remaining jurors' scores: 27 + 27 + 27 + 27 + 27 + 27 + 27 = 189

Second rectification

Based on the competitor's ranking calculated on first rectification scores, red cards are calculated. Scores given by jurors with red cards are omitted (30 in this example)

Calculation of average omitting score 27 (national juror) and score with red card 30 (red card). 28 + 26 + 28 + 25 + 25 = 132: 5 = 26.4

<u>Final score:</u> 26.4 x 7 = <u>184.8</u>

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Attribution of Red Cards

The jurors' scores given to his own competitors will be omitted. After recalculation, these juror scores will be replaced by the average score of all other jurors. The same principle apply for those jurors receiving a red card.

Individual red card

- If the score 30 is found on the 7th place or lower 1 time in a test.
- If the score 29 is found on the 8^h place or lower 1 time in a test.
- If the score 28 is found on the 9th place or lower 1 time in a test.
- If the score 27 is found on the 10th place or lower 1 time in a test.
- If the score 24 is found on the first 1st. place in a test.

Incompetence or unfair judging

In addition to the red cards given automatically by the computer, the Lenience Committee may disqualify jurors whose judging is found to be incompetent or unfair, even if they have not received any red cards.

OMC Lenience Committee

A Lenience Committee will analyze the scores given by jurors who received red cards. The OMC Lenience Committee can remove red cards according to their final objective analysis.

Selection of the best hairstyles (10 or more competitors)

To ensure fairness in all OMC competitions, jurors must be clear, unbiased, systematic, and efficient to accomplish these tasks, below are the recommended judging guidelines and criteria.

The OMC scoring system allows us to focus **only** on the top scores indicated in the boxes. Follow the steps below.

- 1. <u>First walk-through:</u> The jurors look at the general work of all competitors without assessing any scores but taking notes with the plus + and minus signs.
- 2. <u>Second walk-through:</u> Start selecting the top 3 places, following with the 4th and 5th place.
- 3. <u>Select the top 3 scores:</u> The scores 30, 29, 28 must be given only 1 time (check the score chart).
- 4. <u>Score 27:</u> The score 27 can be given a maximum of 2 times (check the score chart).
- 5. <u>Score 26:</u> The score 26 can be given a maximum of 3 times (check the score chart).
- 6. <u>Score 25:</u> The score 25 can be given 4 times. (check the score chart).
- 7. <u>Score 24:</u> The score 24 is not included in the box, it is no longer needed to be assessed. All competitors automatically receive the score of 24.

By following the above steps, you have completed your professional task and may qualify you to be awarded the OMC's Best Juror Award if you have reached 114 points in 1 test.

A juror who receives a red card in a championship does not qualify to receive the Best Juror Award in that championship, even if he/she has reached 114 points.

Suspension / Disqualification / Penalty Rules – Re: Red card page

1. General rules to be observed.

- a. If a juror arrives late at the Jury Room, the General Commissioner will decide if he/she will be admitted in the Jury Room and judge the test.
- b. Jurors are not allowed to leave the Jury Room while waiting to judge, except for going to the restroom.
- c. Once a juror has turned in his scorecard, he must leave the Championship Arena and directly go back to the Jury Room if he/she is selected to judge other tests.
- d. Jurors once they are finished judging, are found to be circulating in the competition arena will have their scores omitted and will not be allowed to continue judging in that championship.

2. Immediate disqualification of jurors

- a. Jurors direct other jurors to see a particular mirror number.
- b. Jurors talking to each other on the competition floor.
- c. Jurors use mobile phones in the Jury Room or on the Competition Floor.
- d. Jurors taking pictures while judging on the Competition Floor.

3. Voiding of Scorecards

If a juror shows inexperience during a competition (skipping a score, illegible scorecard, not completing judging in time), the General Commissioner may disregard his/her scorecard at any time.

4. Consequences of red card attribution

The official notification concerning the red cards will be sent to the jurors' organizations and to the jurors concerned.

5. Disqualification <u>Re: red card page</u>

Equal Results

Individual tests

- 1. The President of the Jury selected by the OMC Official Tally Program according to best judging record.
- 2. In case of equal scores, the scores of the Jury President determine the first place in each test (Ladies and Gents).
- 3. In case the tie is not broken, the computer will continue using the sequence of the jury list down to the last juror.

General Classification in combination or team competitions

If two teams have equal scores, ties will be broken by comparing the scores of the competitors of each team, combination or individual, starting from top downward. The advantage will be given to the competitors/teams that have the highest scores in the following tests:

1.	Ladies Hair by Night	MH
2.	Ladies Romantic Bridal	MH

- 3. Ladies Prestige Gala MH
- 4. Gents Street Cut MH
- 5. Gents Classic Cut MH
- 6. Gents Skin Fade Cut MH

The Best Juror Award will be presented every year to the jurors who have obtained the highest points on a test.

The number of competitors must be 10 or more in a test. A juror receiving a red card does not qualify for the Best Juror Award.

Judging Example - Evaluation

The evaluation is made by adding up the top four (4) competitors' scores of each test. Only jurors reaching 114 points in a test will receive the **"Best Juror Award ".**
